RESTRUCTURING OF THE FOUNDATIONAL STAGE EFFECTIVE FROM 2026-27 ONWARDS: As per the foundational stage admission is to be regulated as per NEP structure and will be reorganized to include three years of pre-primary education before Class 1. The following age criteria will be implemented for these classes:

CLASS	AGE OF ADMISSION
NURSERY/ BAL VATIKA 1	3+ YEARS
LOWER KG/ BAL VATIKA 2	4+ YEARS
UPPER KG/ BAL VATIKA 3	5+ YEARS

A Child may be **admitted to Class I ONLY upon completion of 6 years of age** from Academic Session 2026-27 onwards.

GUIDELINES OF EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION FOR STD. 3 to 5

(Academic Session 2025-2026)

June 30, 2025

Dear Parents/ Guardians (Std. 3 to 5),

With restoration of Board Examinations to the pre-pandemic format and also keeping in view the provisions of Right to Education Act, 2009, the BSA, Govt. of U.P. has introduced New Guidelines for Examination and Promotion from the 2023-2024 session onwards. Kindly note the following points in this regard:

EXAMINATION POLICY

- The School follows the BSA, Govt. of U.P. guidelines and the curriculum as planned by the CBSE for all classes in school.
- Assessments of students are done through different skills they acquire throughout the year.
- A minimum of 75% attendance in an academic session is required to be promoted to the next class.
- As per CBSE norms, exemption will be given to students on account of prolonged illness, loss of mother or father, authorised participation in sports in national or international level, or for any other reasons of similar reports.
- The academic year is divided into two terms for each class and each term has separate assessment reports.

GUIDELINES OF EXAMINATION

- Regular Assessment of the students will be done throughout the Academic Session, through Periodic Tests, Mid Term Exam and Annual Exam.
- Each Periodic Test will be of 25 Marks while Mid Term and Annual Exams will be of 50 Marks each.
- Duration of Periodic test will be 1 Hr. whereas the duration for Mid Term and Annual Examinations will be 2 Hrs
- Syllabus of Std. 3 to 5 will be separate for both the TERMS. The Question Papers for the Mid Term Examination will be set out of the syllabus of the TERM 1 and ANNUAL EXAMINATION will be held from the Syllabus of the TERM 2 ONLY.
- The Question Papers for Std. 3 5 will be provided in the form of Question Paper Booklets itself.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT & TERM EXAM

- The whole Assessment is bifurcated into Internal Assessment and Terminal Examinations.
- Attendance, Subject Enrichment, Project Based Activities, Portfolio, Multiple Assessments and Periodic Tests are the 6 PARTS of Internal Assessment.
- Mid Term Examination and Annual Examination are the **TWO Examinations under Terminal Examinations.**

PASSING CRITERIA FOR STD. 5

- In order to be declared 'PASS' at the end of the session for promotion to the next class, a student **must** score at least 33% marks in each subject.
- The Promotion to the next higher class is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks must be scored in Mid Term Examination plus Annual Examination i.e. 18 Marks out of 70 in each subject.

RE-EXAMINATION FOR STD. 5

- If a student is unable to appear for Annual Exam, he/ she will have to appear for Re-Exam.
- A student who has appeared in the Annual exam is required to appear in Re-Exam in all the failing subjects.

- Re-Exam will be conducted on the same syllabus and pattern as the Annual Exam i.e. 2 Hrs. duration and 50 Marks for Class 5. Weightage of Marks obtained by the student in Re-Examination will be proportionately calculated out of 70 Marks.
- If a student does not secure at least 25% marks in the subject in which he/ she has appeared for Re-Exam and a minimum of 33 out of 100 in that subject,

OR

• If a student does not appear in Re-Exam, then he/ she will be placed in the category of 'ESSENTIAL REPEAT' (ER) and will be held back in the same class.
